- c. Primary contractor and subcontractors are required to be properly licensed with the City of Greenwood.
- d. Contractor to coordinate with the Lander University Project Manager for issues such as start date, daily schedule, weekend work.
- e. Contractor responsible for enlarging the project documents.
- f. The contractor has the responsibility to provide waste containers and ensure the proper disposal of all waste generated.
- g. Lander University has a zero-tolerance standard for allegation that contractor personnel acted in ways considered un-becoming to the university, have partaken in activity including, but not limited to, harassment, intimidation, catcalling, threatened, and/or undertaken an unwelcomed approach towards university faculty, staff, students, and camp attendees.


- h. Lander University is a tobacco product free campus. The university project manager will handle violations.
