

Lecturer or Teaching Assistant Professor of Criminology Lander University

Faculty rank is based upon credentials and experience. Both Lecturer and Teaching Assistant Professor have opportunities for promotion. Eligible candidates should possess a master's degree in Criminology, Criminal Justice, or related field. Preference given to candidates with significant criminal justice and supervisory experience as well as experience teaching both face-to-face and online courses. The candidate should be committed to teaching excellence, willing to contribute to collaborative efforts in recruitment, retention, and overall departmental growth, and work effectively with a diverse student population.
