What is "Homecoming"?

In the United States, it is a common tradition among colleges and universities to "welcome home" their alumni once a year through an annual celebration. At Lander University, we treat Homecoming as a campus-wide celebration for our alumni *and* our entire community. Students, faculty, staff and alumni are invited to spend an entire week in fellowship with one another through activities and special events that foster the close bond we feel at Lander.

Homecoming Week and the Bearcat Cup

Homecoming festivities are preceded by a week of competitive activities among various homecoming teams. You'll learn more about those activities in the pages that follow. At the end of the week, the team who has accumulated the most points across Homecoming Week will win the coveted Bearcat Cup - a Lander tradition! Not only do our Homecoming Week festivities allow for campus engagement, collaboration and the development of teamwork and social skills, but they're also fun and enjoyable for all who participate.

Who can participate in Homecoming Week

All Lander Students, Faculty, Staff, and Alumni can participate in each event.

Creating a Team

While you are welcome to participate as an individual, you can also create a team of 10-30 students, faculty, staff, or alumni to participate as a team, earning points and competing for the Bearcat Cup! Teams can consist of any group of students, faculty, staff, or alumni, regardless of any official affiliation to an organization or group.

Teams are not participating as an organization and therefore should not be named after an organization. For example: If members of the "Alphabet Club" wish to create a team, they must have 10-30 participants and should find a team name ("ABC Team, Alphabet Crew, etc.). A student can only be listed on one team roster.

Teams will submit a team application, submitting their team captain, team's name, and team roster (first and last names).

The deadline to submit a team application is January 31st at 5:00PM. Late applications will not be accepted.

Homecoming Event Rules

During all Homecoming Week events, all Lander affiliated individuals (students, faculty, staff, and alumni) are expected to act in accordance with the Bearcat Creed and the Lander Student Handbook. Any behaviors in violation of these policies and expectations may result in a Student Conduct discipline action.

All competition rules are outlined in this packet. Failure to abide by these rules, as well as the Lander Student Handbook and Bearcat Creed, will result in team disqualification and potential Student Conduct discipline action. Note: Lander University Campus Engagement reserved the right to update the Homecoming rules at any point throughout the week. Any updates will be shared with the team captains through their Lander email.

Should a question arise about the competition or event rules, a final decision will be made by the Coordinator of Campus Engagement (homecoming@lander.edu).

DEADLINES

January 31st by 5PM	Team Applications Due (King and Queen nominations are included in the application)
February 1st at 8AM	Once approved by the Office of Campus Engagement, King and Queen nominees can begin campaigning on social media and through flyers and posters. All print material must be stamped by the Office of Campus Engagement (third floor CC) before being hung. They can only be hung where there are cork/pushpin strips. No tape can be used to hang posters and flyers on any Lander property.
February 3rd- 7th	King and Queen Nominee Personal Interviews
February 7th by 5PM	Completed banners due to Campus Engagement Office. Note: Teams will sign up for their dress rehearsal time slot.
February 7th at 5PM	Deadline to sign up for the Polar Plunge and Fashion Show.

KING AND QUEEN CANDIDATES

Each team is encouraged to nominate one King and one Queen candidate to serve on the Homecoming Court. They are not required to nominate anyone, and they can choose to only nominate one person. While it is suggested that their nominee is someone competing alongside the team, it is not a requirement.

Teams can co-nominate court nominees (for example, team A and team B can nominate Sally J. for queen and John D. for King. The nominees would campaign as representatives of both teams). There is no limit to how many teams can sponsor a single candidate.

Application and Interviews: Nominees should be registered with the team application. Teams should notify their nominees by January 31st at 5PM. King and Queen nominees will be contacted by Lillian Strawn (<u>lillian.strawn@lander.edu</u>) from the Office of Campus Engagement with an application and to schedule their personal interviews. All interviews will be conducted between February 3rd and February 7th. Nominees will also take a headshot photo at the time of their interview, which will be featured on the Campus Engagement Instagram.

Campaigning: Nominees can begin campaigning on February 1st. Campaigning can be done through social media or posters and flyers. All posters and flyers must be stamped by the Office of Campus Engagement before they can be displayed. Posters and flyers may only be displayed where there are already cork strips and push pins. No tape can be used (no taping on windows or walls, in elevators, or on tables). Flyers and posters cannot be left on tables. Failure to comply with campaigning rules will result in disqualification.

Scoring: King and Queen nominees will receive two scores- one for their personal interview and one for the votes they receive in the campus wide popular vote. The highest scoring king and queen candidates will be the winner, with the first runner up and second runner up being named.

Crowning and Awards: The king nominees will be presented during the halftime of the women's basketball game (Saturday, February 15th beginning at 1:30PM). The queen nominees will be presented during the halftime of the men's basketball game (Saturday, February 15th beginning at 3:30 PM). King and queen nominees must attend both games until the queen has been crowned.

Requirements to serve as a king or queen nominees: All king and queen nominees must be in good standing with Lander, both academically and financially. They must not have any past or pending student conduct violations.

Nominees are required to submit an information sheet and a resume prior to their interview with the Office of Campus Engagement. They must attend a personal interview between February 3rd and February 7th. They must be able to attend the Homecoming parade on Saturday, February 15th at 9:00AM, and both basketball games (beginning at 1:30PM and 3:30PM).
